

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE



IIT Bombay was established in 1958. It was set up with the assistance and participation of the UNESCO, utilising the contribution of the government of the then USSR. It was declared an institution of national importance and was accorded the status of a university, by an Act of Parliament in 1961. Since then, the institute has grown from strength to strength and is recognised as a leader in the field of engineering education and research.

The institute today has over 10,000 students (undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral candidates) with outstanding calibre from around the globe. There are overall, 16 academic departments, 19 Centres, one school of excellence and four interdisciplinary programmes. The research and academic programmes are driven by an outstanding faculty, many of whom are reputed for their research contributions internationally. The institute has also built links with peer universities and institutes, both at the national and international levels, to enhance research and enrich its educational programmes. The alumni have distinguished themselves through their achievements in and contributions to industry, academics, research, business, government and social domains. The institute continues to work closely with the alumni to enhance its activities through interactions in academic and research programmes as well as to mobilise financial support.

Located in Powai, the northern suburb of Mumbai, the IITB Campus is spread over an area of 550 acres and is flanked by hills and lakes, thus bringing together the best advantages of the urban financial capital as well as the lush and serene environment conducive to student life, enabling both academic and recreational engagements. As a fully residential campus it accommodates its students in 17 hostels with in-house dining and has excellent sports and other recreational infrastructure.

In July 2018, the institute was conferred the status of Institute of Eminence by the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Humanities and Social Sciences was founded in 1958. At present, it imparts knowledge cutting across five disciplines: Economics, English, Philosophy, Psychology and Sociology. We also have a Cell for Indian Science and Technology in Sanskrit (CISTS). Our faculty members offer a wide range of courses to all students of B.Tech, M.Tech, M.Phil, & Ph.D.

This department plays a unique and distinctive role in an institute where the ethos of science and technology prevails. It is believed that engineering and the sciences are, by their very nature, humanistic and socially derived enterprises. Hence, a holistic science and technology education necessitates the inclusion of the study of the liberal arts, economics, and the social and behavioural sciences so that the application of the sciences for the improvement of the quality of life is informed by an awareness of humanitarian and social concerns.

Originally known as the Department of Languages, in the year 1964-65, the department had 5 faculty members offering courses on Languages (Russian and English), Economics and Costing, Philosophy (Logic, Ethics), Sociology, Industrial/Organizational Psychology and Management. From 1970 to the early 1990s, the faculty strength went up from 5 to 22 and the department was re-christened as the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences. The current faculty strength is 41.

Since 1973, the department has been running the Ph.D. programme in all the five disciplines providing impetus and laying major thrust on inter-disciplinary topics. In July 1993, the department launched a four-semester interdisciplinary M.Phil. programme with Specialisation in Planning and Development at the postgraduate level. The programme, with its theoretical-practical approach, provides the students with a holistic understanding of contemporary socio-economic realities and the role of technology en-route towards sustainable development.

At the department-level, students have access to the resources available in the Department Library and Computer Lab. The department also possesses a well-equipped Language Laboratory and a Psychology Laboratory. For the fulfilment of its teaching and research goals, the department has competent faculty members who keep pace with the current developments in their fields of specialization.

Based on the IIT Bombay Future Vision 2010, Growth Plan of HSS documents (1996-1998), a review and restructuring of the undergraduate programme was implemented. Shortly, foreign student affiliations began with the study abroad programme. Apart from the augmentation of individual research as well as sponsored activities, the department has also placed emphasis on establishing collaborations with the outside world through industries, business houses & NGOs.

M.PHIL. COURSE STRUCTURE

The M.Phil. Programme consists of four semesters. The course structure, along with the minimum number of credits required per semester, is as follows:

Points to Note:

- There will be a compulsory Field Trip for 10 days at the end of the First Semester.
- A compulsory course on Communication Skills (I and II) will have to be taken during the Second Semester.
- Core Courses are provided by the Department only.
- A minimum of 1 UG Elective, 3 Departmental Electives and 1 Institute Elective (course from another department) are to be taken during the entire duration of the course.
- There is no restriction on the number of credits one takes in a semester. Please choose the number of credits wisely as per your capacity to handle the courses.
- Attendance in first three lectures of every course is compulsory.
- Lectures of Communication Skills (I and II) are compulsory to attend with a minimum attendance requirement of 80% along with successful completion of IITBombayx Online Course.
- Audit courses and Non-credit courses can be taken from any department of the Institute as per interest.
- Audit courses and Non-credit courses are reflected on the mark sheet, only if you adhere to the instructions given by the Course Evaluator/Teacher, which may differ from course to course.
- One can take up audit courses up to a maximum of 3 per semester.
- There are two sets of examinations in each semester.
- The mid semester examinations usually take place around September Second week (Autumn Semester) and Feb third week (Spring Semester).

- The end semester examinations take place around mid-November (Autumn Semester) and mid-April (Spring Semester).
- Explore the ASC portal (http://asc.iitb.ac.in) for Academic Personal Details such as your CPI (Cumulative Performance Index)/SPI (Semester Performance Index) and courses registered and Scholarship related details.
- Remember to register your Canara Bank Account number on the ASC webpage.

Grading Policy:

For every course, a student is assigned a grade based on his/her combined performance over the semester in all the assessments in that course. These grades are described by the letters AP, AA, AB, BB, BC, CC, CD, DD, FF, FR and XX, each of which indicates a qualitative assessment of the student's performance along with a quantitative (numeric) equivalent called the grade point as given below:





THINGS TO KNOW:

Once the academic life on campus resumes, here are some things for you to know:

- Always carry your ID Card.
- Remember to submit your TA Form to TA Duty Coordinator every month in the department office.
- Those who have qualified for JRF need not do the TA form submission every month but they have to submit the required documents at the academic section of the main building.
- Download the M-Indicator app on your phone to find your way around Mumbai. It provides timings of local trains and buses along with auto and taxi fares.
- The nearest station to the IIT-B campus is Kanjurmarg, which is located on the Central Line of the local train network.
- Download the Insti Map app on your phone to find your way around the campus.
- Do take out time to enjoy the glorious sunset at boathouse (lakeside) and a beautiful view of the campus from Sameer Hill. The official timings to visit these places are 6 am - 6 pm.
 (Don't forget to keep your mosquito repellent with you.)
- To satisfy midnight hunger pangs, every hostel has a canteen which usually opens in the evening and runs till 3 am.

Other things to remember:

- Join Facebook groups like Freshmen Group, IITB Food Recommendations (while you get adjusted to mess food), Buy and Sell IITB (for all purchases/sales inside IITB), Hostel Groups.

- Subscribe your official institute email ID to the Events mailing list to stay informed about the various events happening on campus.

STUDENT WELLNESS CENTRE (SWC)

LIBRARY AND COMPUTING FACILITIES AT HSS

Teaching and research in the HSS department are supported by excellent computing facilities and a small but well-managed library. The library houses a sizeable collection of the old issues of various magazine such as *The Economist, The Economic and Political Weekly and The Times Literary Supplement,* M.Phil., and PhD dissertations of its students and a number of books on various subjects donated by the faculty and the students of the department. In addition to well-stocked collection of books, the library has two computers and sufficient space for reading.

The department has a common computer lab with ample space for reading for the Bachelor's, Master's and research students. The Department has a full-fledged Language Laboratory, which offers a variety of services such as Recording, High Speed Copying, Test Preparation, Intercom, Student Monitoring, etc. The Department also boasts of having a Psychophysiology Laboratory, which caters to the needs of research related to experimental cognitive psychology, psychophysiology, cognitive neuroscience and criminal psychology, and an Infant Language Centre, which is the first of its kind in the country to study the very early stages of language development in young children.
