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ABOUT THE INSTITUTE



IIT Bombay was established in 1958. It was set up with the assistance and participation of the UNESCO, utilizing the contribution of the government of the then USSR. It was declared an institution of national importance and was accorded the status of a university, by an Act of Parliament in 1961. Since then, the institute has grown from strength to strength and is recognized as a leader in the field of engineering education and research. The Indian Institute of Technology Bombay is one of the twenty three Indian Institutes of Technology in the country set up with the objectives of making available the facilities for higher education, research and training in various fields, such as, Science, Technology, Humanities, Social Sciences, Management, Design, etc.

The Institute is located at Powai on a campus spread over about 480 acres amidst picturesque surroundings, with Vihar and Powai lakes on its either side. Hence, bringing together the best advantages of the urban financial capital as well as the lush and serene environment conducive to student life, enabling both academic and recreational engagements. At present, it has fifteen science and technology Departments including the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) and twenty-four interdisciplinary groups/ centers/ schools/ interdisciplinary programmes which offer various undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral academic programmes. The institute today has over 10,000 students (undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral candidates) with outstanding caliber from around the globe. The research and academic programs are driven by an outstanding faculty, many of whom are reputed for their research contributions internationally. The institute has also built links with peer universities and institutes, both at the national and international levels, to enhance research and enrich its educational programs. The alumni have distinguished themselves through their achievements in and contributions to industry, academics, research, business, government and social domains. The institute continues to work closely with the alumni to enhance its activities through interactions in academic and research programs as well as to mobilize financial support. As a fully residential campus it accommodates its students in 18 hostels with in-house dining and has excellent sports and other recreational infrastructure.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT



The Department of Humanities and Social Sciences was founded in 1958. Originally known as the Department of Languages, in the year 1964–65, the department had 5 faculty members offering courses on Languages (Russian and English), Economics and Costing, Philosophy (Logic, Ethics), Sociology, Industrial/Organizational Psychology and Management. From 1970 to the 2020s, the faculty strength went up from 5 to 41 and the department was re-christened as the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences. It has a Four-Year B.S. Programme in Economics and also offers a wide range of courses to the B. Tech, MTech, M.A. & Ph.D. students. HSS Department courses are also attended by students of School of Management, Centre for Technology Alternatives for Rural Areas (CTARA), Centre for Policy Studies (CPS), IDP in Climate Studies and students of other interdisciplinary programmes.

The Department has Ph.D. programmes in Economics, Sociology, Psychology, Literature, Linguistics, Philosophy, and Sanskrit and an M.A. Programme in Humanities and Social Sciences with specialization in Research. We also have a Cell for Indian Science and Technology in Sanskrit (CISTS). Shortly, foreign student affiliations began with the study abroad programme. Apart from the augmentation of individual research as well as sponsored activities, the department has also placed emphasis on establishing collaborations with the outside world through industries, business houses & NGOs. At the department-level, students have access to the resources available in the Department Library and Computer Lab. The department also possesses a well-equipped Language Laboratory and a Psychology Laboratory. For the fulfilment of its teaching and research goals, the department has competent faculty members who keep pace with the current developments in their fields of specialization. The library has more than 2,40,000 Books, Theses, CDs & Videos. It has about 1,18,925 bound volumes of journals and more than 40,000 print/online journals.At present, about two hundred and twenty-five research scholars are working towards their Ph.D. degree. About two hundred students of this Department taketheir Ph.D. have already degree in Economics/Literature/Linguistics/Psychology/Philosophy/Sociology/Sanskrit and they are now well placed. HSS Department Alumni have made a mark as excellent academicians and professionals. The Department faculty members also guide B.Tech., M.Tech., and M.Des. Projects offered by the Engineering Departments and InterDisciplinary Groups. Faculty members of the Department also have been guiding Ph.D. in the other centers of the Institute like CTARA, Centre for Policy Studies and Climate Studies. In 2022, the department launched a four-semester interdisciplinary M.A. programme with Specialisation in Research at the postgraduate level.

There has been an increasing awareness that social reality and development are quite complex phenomena, which can be understood in their totality only by adopting an inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary approach. The holistic understanding of socio-economic reality and of the various stages of development, and the availability of the expertise involved in the formulation and implementation of development policies can bring about a more sustainable and desirable development. It is in this context that the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences launched the M.A. Programme with specialization in Research, which gives both a historical account of societal view both during the existence of research and thereafter. The programme, with its theoretical-practical approach, provides the students with a holistic understanding of contemporary socio-economic realities and the role of technology en-route towards sustainable development. The programme includes both coursework and field work and requires the completion of a thesis. It is expected that students emerging from this programme will be capable of steering the national, state and regional planning and developmental processes. SALIENT FEATURES

- 1. The entering students will take four common courses in the first semester.
- 2. Prior to the start of the second semester, students will select one of the three specialisations.
- 3. The research project option shall be the default option for the programme. Eligible students may elect to complete the degree with a thesis.
- 4. All courses are open across all tracks to allow for a more student-driven approach to course selection, and to support disciplinary crossovers.
- 5. The research component begins in the very 1st semester with four methods courses, followed by a seminar style 4-credit course in the 2nd semester for proposal writing, ethics clearances as needed, peer and faculty reviews. The actual independent research work (Project/s or Thesis) will span the 3rd and 4th semesters.

LIBRARY AND COMMUTING FACILITIES

Teaching and research in the HSS department are supported by excellent computing facilities and a small but well-managed library. The library houses a sizeable collection of the old issues of various magazine such as The Economist, The Economic and Political Weekly and The Times Literary Supplement, M.Phil., and PhD dissertations of its students and a number of books on various subjects donated by the faculty and the students of the department. The library has more than 2,40,000 Books, Theses, CDs & Videos. It has about 1,18,925 bound volumes of journals and more than 40,000 print/online journals. In addition to well-stocked collection of books, the library has two computers and sufficient space for reading. The department has a common computer lab with ample space for reading for the Bachelor's, Master's and research students. The Department has a full-fledged Language Laboratory, which offers a variety of services such as Recording, High Speed Copying, Test Preparation, Intercom, Student Monitoring, etc. The Department also boasts of having a Psychophysiology Laboratory (psychophysiologylab@hss.iitb.ac.in) ,which caters to the needs of research related to experimental cognitive psychology, psychophysiology, cognitive neuroscience and criminal psychology, and an Infant Language Centre, which is the first of its kind in the country to study the very early stages of language development in young children. STUDENT WELLNESS CENTRE


GENDER CELL
